Extending Patrolling Season

Background

- o For the past 8 years the PWV patrolling season has been Mid-January to September 31.
- Stated Rational was due to the danger of high-powered hunting season.
- o Deer, Elk and Moose Hunting season this year is a total of 35 days.

Bear	September 2 - 30
Moose	October 1 - 14
Separate limited elk (1st season)	16 - 20
Combined deer/elk (2 nd season)	October 30 - November 7
Combined deer/elk (3 rd season)	November 13 - 19
Combined Limited deer/elk (4th	November 24 - 28
season)	

The Executive Committee approved, for 2021 an extension of the patrolling season until
October 31. Patrollers are required to wear safety vest.

- Rational for Extending the Season
 - o PWV's education functions are important year round.
 - o There are a lot of visitors still out hiking our trails in the winter.
 - As of October 19, PWV has:
 - Done 20 patrols this month
 - Contacted 172 people
 - Seen 1 hunter (Grouse hunter on West Branch)
- Concerns for Extending the Season
 - Safety issues concerning hunters
 - Accidently being shot
 - Dealing with hunting regulations
 - Dealing with hunters

- How we Could Mitigate the Concerns
 - Patrol wearing safety vest
 - o Patrollers staying on the trail
 - Patrollers should not attempt to enforce or address hunting regulations. (The Forest Service has no responsibility for hunting.)
 - o Hunters are just another visitor type and should be treated the same as any other visitor.

Options

- Keep the season as it has been.
- o Extend the season to include all year.
- o Extend the season but not all year.
