

Original Non-Patrolling Charter

<u>Policy for Motion #1</u> "While the primary role of most Poudre Wilderness Volunteers is to patrol trails in the Canyon Lakes Ranger district, membership is also open to individuals who wish to serve PWV in other ways. These members will embrace PWV's mission, values, and goals; and will bring to the organization skills required to support

PWV, such as office and administrative support, fund-raising, member training, affiliation activities, website development and maintenance, computer programming and database management, various communication and publication roles, public outreach and recruiting ... These members are required to be sponsored by a Committee Chair or member of the Board of Directors, hereinafter "sponsor". Non-patrolling members are expected to meet all requirements and duties as specified by their sponsors and will wear the PWV uniform when/if dealing with the public in their official duties.

They shall endeavor to fulfill all duties as agreed to with their sponsor in their areas of support. Non-patrolling members are expected, but not required, to commit to at least 36 hours of PWV volunteer service per year...." <u>Policy for Motion #2</u>
